

CURRICULUM NEWS by Mr Fenton

In Year 3, the children have been having lots of fun learning about the Stone Age. The children have been writing stories about meeting cavemen and the descriptive techniques they have been using are amazing! Having explored our extreme earth, the children were thrilled to return to the Stone and Bronze Ages and had to make the difficult decision about which era they would rather live in. They have compared the rocks in the playground with the rocks in Mrs Hart's driveway. Mrs Hart was very pleased to find out that her driveway is made of hard rocks that will last a long time!



The Year 4 children spent a beautiful sunny day exploring Reading museum and Roman experience - a trip that was thoroughly enjoyed by all. In maths the children have been learning how to round 4 digit numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. They are now looking at how to add using columns and exchanging. As part of their topic work on Roman Britain, the children ventured into the school's environment area to hunt for hidden treasure. I'm told they were fortunate enough to find a stash of Roman coins - they also discovered some other items which they decided probably weren't Roman at all!

Year 5 are thoroughly enjoying their ancient Egyptian topic. The children have been using Lego to design and build their own Egyptian inspired pieces; pyramids, sphinxes and cartouches. They have then used these amazing creations to write instructions - who would have thought writing instructions could be such fun? They will be putting their instruction writing to the test in the final week, swapping them around and trying to follow each other's instructions carefully! I look forward to seeing the results! I am told they also been learning about ancient Egyptian hieroglyphs and having fun playing hangman using them.



In Year 6 the children have enjoyed getting somewhat messy creating some impressive blitz skyline artwork (sorry parents – and on a Monday too!) They have also been looking at rationing in WWII and had the opportunity to make some authentic recipes – carrot jam and potato cakes. I had the pleasure of sampling these and can report that they were actually quite tasty. In English we have been writing a balanced argument based on a dilemma from 'Friend or Foe.' In maths, the children have been working out some tricky short division and multiplication sums.


