### Vision and Aims

Our vision at Emmbrook Junior School is to ensure all our pupils have the confidence, understanding, knowledge and positivity to lead a healthy and active lifestyle through the eyes of Physical Education and Sport.

- To provide all the resources and knowledge for pupils to improve in all aspects of Sport and PE
- Ensuring pupils enjoy productive and inclusive PE Lessons
- To provide ample sporting activities through Breakfast, Lunchtime and After School
- Increase skill sets to challenge and compete in School representation
- To give the opportunity for **ALL** children to represent the school in various sports and competitions

### Evaluation

2017/2018 has once again been a productive and exciting year at Emmbrook Junior School. The school entered in to over 11 sporting tournaments, 4 leagues (Football, Rugby, Cross Country and Cricket) competing in over 35 matches across the leagues and several festival days.

Amongst the various tournaments, leagues and matches the school had claimed accolades such as Winning Division 3 of the 6 Nations Tag Rugby league and runners up of Division 2 of the 6 Nations Tag Rugby league the following term. Emmbrook also won Division 1 of the Wokingham Schools Cricket League and reached the semifinals of both the WSCL Festival day and the Games Mark Cricket Competition.

The school created the Wokingham Schools' Cricket League and is responsible for all administrative tasks, including communication and presenting results that is now played among 24 schools in the Wokingham area.

87% of all pupils at Emmbrook Junior School attended either a Lunch time club or after school club  
64% of PPG and SEN children attended either a lunch time club or after school club  
36% of PPG and SEN children represented the school in competitive matches or tournaments

The Spartan club, a club held at a lunchtime, designed for those children in receipt of the PPG and who are on our SEN register, has increased their confidence to work as part of a team and to have the confidence to take part in afterschool clubs and represent the school within sporting competitions.

Moving forward we will be looking to enter in to more tournaments that can give different opportunities to children. As well as this we want to focus on Girls and B team fixtures across the sports, again to give more opportunity to children to represent the school.
