- Ensuring children enjoy productive and inclusive PE Lessons
- To provide ample sporting activities through extra-curricular activity
- Increase skill sets to challenge and compete in school representation
- To increase participation in competitive sports both through intra-mural competition and inter-school competition
- To provide opportunities for children to represent their house and school in competitive sport.

Evaluation

INTER-SCHOOL SPORTING EVENTS

Emmbrook Junior School took part in a total of 34 Inter-School different sporting events in 2023-2024 including Festivals, Competitions, A & B Team matches, Introductions to Sports/Beginner events, SEND events, Tournaments and County Competitions against other Wokingham/Berkshire Schools.

The Inter-School events included the following wide range of sports events: New Age Kurling; Cross-country races and relays; Tag-Rugby and Touch Rugby; Football (girls and boys); Netball (girls and boys); Sportshall Athletics (Years 3&4 and Years 5&6); Boccia, In2Hockey, SMASH Badminton; Tennis, Cricket; and Gateway Golf.

The Emmbrook Junior Year 6 Sports Leaders also undertook Leadership Academy training where they planned and led groups of Year 3 children (including Year 3 children from Emmbrook) at an Inter-school festival for Sports Multiskills.

The Year3/4 Athletics Team represented Wokingham District at Berkshire Athletics Finals as part of the Berkshire School Games in Spring 2024.

The KS2 Multiskills Team competed against other Berkshire schools as part of the Berkshire School Games in Summer 2024 in the SEND Panathlon.

144/257 (56.03%) children took part in one or more Inter-School events in 2023-2024

25/41 (60.98%) SEND children represented their school in at least one sporting event in 2023-2024.

15/25 (60%) PP/FSM children represented Emmbrook School at one or more sporting events in 2023-2024.

After-school fixtures such as league football matches arranged for days when CT not leading club.

In case of event with fixed date then an extra club session was added to end of term for CT or covered by staff volunteer = £0.

INTRA-SCHOOL SPORTING EVENTS

<u>All</u> children (100%) took part in 9 or more Intra-School sporting events (Inter-House competitions, School Games Day competitions, Sports Leader competitions, Inter-Class competitions, Year Group competitions at lunch times): Football, Basketball, New Age Kurling, Boccia, Tennis, Diamond Cricket, Tag-Rugby, Dodgeball, Sports Leader Games/Multi-skills and Netball/Benchball.
