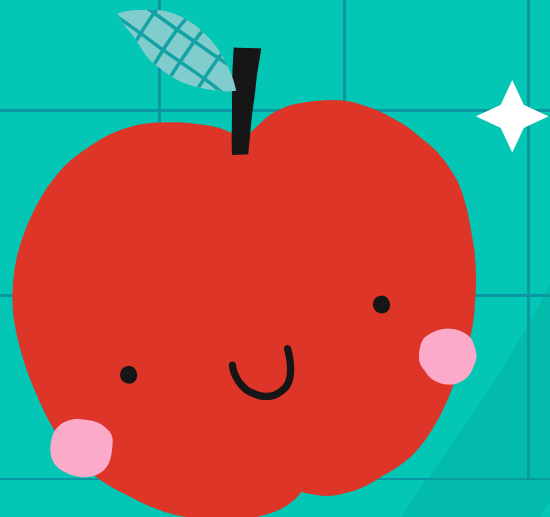




I'M MOVING TO YEAR 6

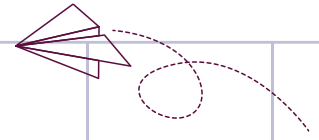


Mrs Preston

Q: When are my PE days?

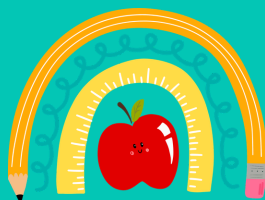
A: Year 6 PE days are Wednesdays and Fridays.

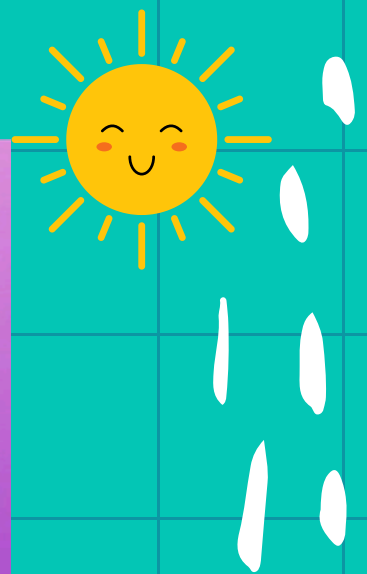
Q: What if I am not going on the residential trip?
